- Greece is in Europe
- Greece is located in Southern Europe, between Albania and Turkey.
- It borders the Aegean Sea, Ionian Sea and the Mediterranean Sea.
- Albania, Bulgaria, Macedonia and Turkey all border Greece.
- The coastline of Greece is an impressive 13,676 km in length.
- Greece consists of a large mainland, two smaller peninsulas and a large number of islands. Some of the most well-known islands include Crete, Rhodes and Corfu.
- 80% of Greece is mountainous.
- The capital city of Greece is Athens
- Crete is the largest of the Greek islands
- The climate of Greece is primarily Mediterranean (mild winters and hot, dry summers)
- Mount Olympus is the tallest mountain in Greece
- The Global Pandemic impacted on the Greek economy, tourism and daily life.
- The Greek culture can be seen through festivals and food
