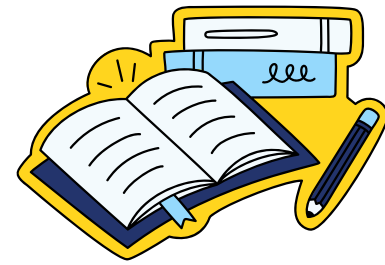

We have lots to look forward to next week, with our Year 6 residential visit to London and NSPCC Number Day on Friday.

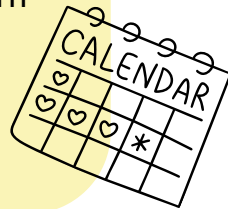

STAY SAFE

SAFEGUARDING BEFORE SCHOOL

We understand that as children move into the older year groups, parents begin to give them a little more freedom and allow them to walk to school alone or with friends. This is a great way of preparing the children for high school.

However, we have spoken to a number of children, mainly from Year 5, in recent weeks who are not waiting by the gate as parents might expect. Instead they have been discovered out of sight of the school, playing on the pathway leading down to the bypass. In some cases the children have been running down to the bottom of the steps near the main road.

We have explained to all the children that they have been trusted, by their adults, to walk to school and keep themselves safe. They should not, under any circumstances, run down towards the bypass or touch any litter or objects they might find in the undergrowth.

Please can we ask that parents and carers re-iterate this message to any children who come to school without supervision.
